## **IT'S OFFICIAL - NAMIBIA'S ONLY LIGHT BEER, WINDHOEK LIGHT IS THE WORLD'S CHAMPION LIGHT BEER.**

Namibia Breweries Limited (NBL) was one of three new entrants to the Brewing Industry International Awards, which is held every second year. The Brewing Industry International Awards was first held in 1886 and is structured to broadly reflect the global market for beer as understood by the majority of consumers.

Windhoek Light took Gold in the Non-Alcoholic & Low Alcohol Beers Category. This 2.4% Alcohol by Volume (AVB) beer is a refreshing crisp light beer carefully brewed the Reinheitsgebot way using natural ingredients only; malted barley, hops and water. Low in alcohol and kilojoules without compromising on taste it contains no preservatives or artificial ingredients and is the ideal beer for the health conscious beer lover. Light gold in colour and offering sessionable control, Windhoek light a healthier choice as endorsed by the South African Heart Foundation. The runners up in the category were Radegast Birell (Nosovice, Czech Republic) and C2 (Burton on Trent, UK) with Silver and Bronze, respectively.

This year 30 expert brewers from 17 countries judged 752 beers from 43 countries making it not only the world's most professional but also truly international beer competition. And from the 752 beers judged, Windhoek Light emerged Nr 1.

The entrees are judged by an international panel of practicing brewers. Afterwards, the Gold Award winners in each category are re-judged by the entire panel to select the Champion Beer (and trophy winner) for that specific category.

It is the second time this year that NBL receives international recognition for its quality beverages. Earlier in 2005, NBL entered the annual DLG Awards (Deutsche Landwirtschafts-Gesellschaft) in Berlin for the first time and walked off with four awards – a Gold Award each for Windhoek Lager and Windhoek Draught and a Silver Award for Tafel Lager and Windhoek Light, respectively. NBL winning the DLG awards was not only a first for Namibia, but a first for the African continent as it is the first time an African brewery has ever won at the DLG. The DLG Society was founded in 1885 and is internationally recognized as one of the biggest and most highly regarded specialist organizations in the food and beverage sectors.

Once again, our member, Namibia Breweries just does not seem to take a back seat and rightfully so, they have proven that they are indeed up there with the best. This award is just another milestone met by one of the Team members which every Namibian should be proud of!

## SPF 30 SUN BLOCK, MANUFACTURED IN NAMIBIA

It employs 270 Namibians directly and supports 2500-3000 jobs indirectly through the mobile homes and the extensive dealership network.

## A RECIPE FOR THE HOLIDAY SEASON

Creamy blue cheese sauce a la Daniela (4 Persons)

250ml Fresh Creme, preferably from Dani's Küche & Dani's Garten 250g Creamy Blue from Dani's Küche & Dani's Garten 5 ml olive or sunflower oil 1 Onion, finely chopped Salt Course black pepper 50ml Cream Sherry or Dry White Wine Chopped fresh parsley

Heat up the creme in a small saucepan over low heat.

During that, soften the onions in olive or sunflower oil in a small pan, do not brown. Slowly add the crumbled Creamy Blue into the cream and stir until the cheese is melted. Add the softened onions. Add the Cream Sherry or white wine and toss to mix. Season with a little bit of salt, not too much because of the blue cheese, and course pepper. Sprinkle with fresh chopped parsley  
Serve with Spaghetti, Tagliatelle or any kind of Seafood.
